## **Village of Airmont History**

About 200 million years ago our village was on the continent of Pangaea. The Ramapo Mountains were higher than the Himalayas. Over the millennia the mountains have settled to their present state. After the last ice age, about 10,000 years ago, our Village was at the bottom of Lake Newark.

As the weather warmed, the waters receded. The American Indian moved right in. Food and water were plentiful, so they lived here in relative peace for thousands of years. But this was to change. By 1675 the Tallman family had settled on their farm in Nyack. They were the first of many to come. By the 1820's people were getting tired of using the old Indian trails to get to the Hudson River. A new road was proposed and in 1828, Route 59 was opened. The farmers of Airmont could now ship by horse and wagon to the river, but a faster mode of transportation was needed. It came in 1841 with the opening of the Piermont branch railroad.

In 1850 Airmont had its first school subsidized by the Pierson family of Ramapo. In 1851 Airmont is visited by Daniel Webster who rode a railroad flat car through our village. In 1890 the wife of Reverend Bodine of the Lutheran Church first coins the name Airmont. By 1940 a police department was established in Ramapo, covering Airmont, with Chief Abe Stern and a small force of men.

The rate of growth is slow in the 1940's and 1950's, but with the opening of the Thomas E. Dewey Thruway and the Tappan Zee Bridge the population soared. Our agricultural era is coming to an end.



## **Village of Airmont History (cont'd)**

In 1985 formal proposals for the new village stretch over an area from the N.Y. Thruway in the north to the N.J. border in the south and from Saddle River Road in the east, westward to the Village of Suffern. Airmont residents voted, in 1989, by a three to one margin to form their own village. Airmont's first mayor, Maureen Kendrick, was elected in 1991, followed by Ralph Bracco, Ray Kane, John Layne, Dennis Kay and Veronica Boesch.

Today the Village of Airmont occupies a five-square-mile area in Rockland County. The area, as depicted by its logo, occupies a geographically advantaged position in the Ramapo Mountains. It enjoys, by virtue of the ever-present dense greenery, a fresh air environment. Hence, the Village's name is a combination of nature's finest endowments: air, mountains (Airmont) and greenery. Its terrain is characterized by gently rolling topography and its governing body has a strong focus on conservation of the natural environment.

Incorporated in 1991, Airmont is a community of 9,000 people residing in 2,500 homes. Its culture is represented by people of all races and creeds. Numerous businesses and services are available to the Village residents and to its visitors, including several major banks and shopping centers.

## **Garbage & Recycling Reminders**

Garbage is picked on one of the two route schedules listed below.

### **Route #1 - Monday & Thursday**

### **Route #2 - Tuesday & Friday**

The hours of pick up is between 6:00 AM and 6:00 PM.

Please note the following:

- Trash shall be set out no earlier than 3:00 p.m. on the day prior to collection, and all containers shall be removed no later than 8:00 p.m. on the collection day.
- Refuse from demolished or newly constructed buildings, materials left over from home improvements and remodeling projects relating to existing residence (lumber, paneling, rolled insulating wiring, pipes, plaster, concrete and bricks) are not considered trash and will not be picked up.
- Bulk items (anything other than normal household garbage as otherwise set forth below) are picked up on second garbage day and must be placed at curb no earlier than 5 PM the day before pick up. **BULK ITEMS NOT TO EXCEED 4 -5 ITEMS PER HOUSEHOLD PER BULK DAY**
- All Recycling is done on Wednesday. Bins are to be left on the curb for recycling.
- No recycling bins may be placed at the curb prior to 5 PM on Tuesday night.
- Please do not place household garbage cans at curb. Village has yard side pickup.
- All yard waste (leaves, grass, etc) will be picked up on Thursdays from April - December. (Must be in biodegradable bags)
- Regular garbage (bulk and leaf bags excluded) is picked up on all holidays unless otherwise noted

## General Guidelines

**Car batteries and used motor oil:** Drop off at Household Hazardous Waste Facility, Pomona, NY. DO NOT dump used motor oil in sewers or ground.

**Corrugated Cardboard:** Corrugated cardboard is also recyclable, and must be cut or folded into manageable bundles and tied.

**Latex:** Only Latex paint cans may be put out for garbage. Must be opened and dried out.

**Leaves and Grass:** Must be put in biodegradable bags. If put in plastic bags they will not be picked up on Thursdays, April - December. Use a mulching lawn mower so that there is no need to bag your clippings.

**Recyclables:** Place bins curbside the night before collection. Bring bins in immediately after collection. Place newspapers, including all inserts, in newspaper bin. Place glass, plastic, and cans (tin, aluminum, bi-metals) in bin. Keep corrugated cardboard separate from newspaper bin. Glass, plastic, cans, bin and containers should be rinsed to remove all excess food.

**Tires:** Automobile tires will also be picked up only if you obtain a disposal sticker from Village Hall. There is a \$5.00 fee per tire. When purchasing new tires you should leave the old ones with the dealer to avoid this expense.

**Tree Branches:** Cut into sections less than four (4) feet in length and each section to be bundled and tied.

**Twigs:** Must be tied in four (4) feet bundle

**DO NOT Place the following in recycling bins; paper bags or plastic bags; light bulbs; china; and porcelain.**
